

Transit Service Updates

Updated May 5th, 2020

As the shelter-in-place continues until at least May 31st, transit agencies have continued to modify and reduce service to adhere to a major decline in ridership rates. The information below is subject to change and we will continue to update as we receive more information.

BART:

Bart's current weekday schedule is 5am-9pm with Saturday and Sunday service from 8am-9pm.

Starting Wednesday, April 8th, trains will run in 30-minute intervals Monday-Friday.

Starting Wednesday, April 22nd, commuters on BART will now be required to wear a face mask or covering on station platforms and on-board trains.

BART is moving forward with a [track replacement project](#) in Orinda station, which will require track shutdowns between Lafayette and Rockridge Stations on the following weekends:

- May 9-10
- May 23-25 (Memorial Day weekend)
- June 6-7
- June 20-21
- July 4-5

Free shuttle buses will replace trains on those weekends, but riders should expect delays of 20-25 minutes. [Click Here](#) for a BART's factsheet on the project.

SFMTA:

SFMTA has [announced](#) service reductions to their 17 most-used lines. Starting Wednesday, April 8th, only the following 17 core routes will be the still be in service:

- N Judah Bus
- L Taraval Bus
- T Third Bus
- 1 California
- 8 Bayshore
- 9 San Bruno
- 14 Mission
- 14R Mission Rapid
- 19 Polk
- 22 Fillmore
- 24 Divisadero
- 25 Treasure Island
- 29 Sunset
- 38 Geary
- 38R Geary Rapid
- 44 O'Shaughnessy
- 49 Van Ness/Mission

Beginning Saturday, April 25th, the following lines will [some service restored](#):

- 5 Fulton
- 12 Folsom
- 28 19th Avenue
- 54 Felton
- 714 BART Early Bird Shuttle

In addition, the 9 San Bruno, L Bus, and N Bus will have increased bus frequencies, and the 38R will have weekend service returning.

For paratransit users, SFMTA has announced the [Essential Trip Card](#) program to subsidize seniors and those with disabilities to make essential trips in taxis.

In addition, SFMTA has temporarily suspended [parking enforcement](#) measures to street cleaning and parking. Violation tickets will not be issued for the following:

- Surpassing 72-hour parking limits
- Exceeding time limit parking
- Parking without Residential Permit Parking (RPP) permits
- Parking in towaway zones during peak hours
- Parking in streets due for street cleanings
- Commuter shuttles parking improperly

Meter rates have been reduced to \$0.50/hour for vehicle and \$0.10/hour for motorcycles.

Please note SFMTA **will continue** enforcing parking rules if parked near fire hydrant, red, yellow, and white zones (except in front of school as they are out of session). Any parking in transit or bike lanes will be enforced.

[AC Transit:](#)

Transbay service lines F, NL, O, and 800 will continue operation, with many local lines operating on a Sunday schedule. Weekday-only lines for both local and Transbay lines will not be operating.

[Fare payment](#) is **not** required until further notice and rear-door boarding has been implemented.

[Caltrain:](#)

Caltrain will begin having a reduced weekday schedules, where they have limited the number of trains from 92 to 42 trains per day. Local weekday stops between San Jose and San Francisco will be made approximately every hour. [Click here](#) for the timetables.

Limited and Baby Bullet trains service will be suspended until further notice.

Golden Gate Transit:

Golden Gate Ferry is currently operating reduced weekday service. Weekend ferry service has been suspended. [Click Here](#) for ferry schedules.

Golden Gate Bus is undergoing service adjustments. Additional changes may be necessary and will be announced via [@GoldenGateBus](#) on Twitter and the [Transit](#) app. [Click Here](#) for bus schedules.

Beginning [April 15](#), Golden Gate Transit and Ferry will be limiting passengers and require face masks on board their vehicles.

Samtrans:

Beginning April 26th, Samtrans will be implementing a modified schedule with service reductions on 31 routes. [Click Here](#) for route-by-route information.

Fare will not be required to ride Samtrans and rear-boarding has been implemented on buses. Riders and operators will be required to wear face coverings. Riders needing assistance will still be able to board through the front doors.

Please note Samtrans is operating on a non-school day schedule during the weekdays and will not serve stops labeled as “School Days Only”.

SF Bay Ferry:

The following changes are in effect as of March 17:

- Reduced weekday service on the Alameda/Oakland and Vallejo routes
- No service on the Richmond, Harbor Bay or South San Francisco ferry routes
- No weekend service or service to Pier 41 on any routes
