

Transit Service Updates

Updated July 16th, 2020

As the shelter-in-place continues indefinitely, transit agencies have continued to modify service to adhere to a major decline in ridership rates. The information below is subject to change and we will continue to update it as we receive more information.

Clipper has announced the launch of an 18-month pilot of their START program, which would offer fare discounts on certain transit services for low-income adults between the ages of 19 and 64.

Adults with an annual household income of no more than twice the federal poverty level are eligible for the Clipper START program, which offers 50% fare discounts on Caltrain, Muni, and Golden Gate Transit and Ferry, and 20% fare discounts on BART.

BART:

Bart's current weekday schedule is 5am-9pm with Saturday and Sunday service from 8am-9pm.

As of Wednesday, April 8th, trains will run in 30-minute intervals Monday-Friday.

As of Wednesday, April 22nd, commuters on BART will now be required to wear a face mask or covering on station platforms and on-board trains.

As of June 8th, BART will be running trains every 15 minutes from 6am to 7:30am and 3:40pm to 5:10pm between Daly City and Pleasant Hill Stations. First hour of service adjustments have also been made to the *Warm Springs to Daly City* (Green) and *Warm Springs to Richmond* (Orange) lines, which will depart at 4:57am and 5:00am, respectively. Finally, a 5:07am Blue Line train leaving Daly City to Dublin and a 5:10am Yellow Line train leaving Daly City to Antioch has been restored for the weekdays. As of June 29th, BART has eliminated the sales of paper BART tickets at Montgomery and Civic Center Stations to create a more contactless system in the COVID-19 era. The only fare product available for purchase will be the reusable, reloadable and regionally accepted Clipper Card, but riders will still be able to use paper tickets to enter or exit through fare gates.

BART has released a factsheet of their 15-step plan to welcome back commuters as the region reopens, which includes sanitation, increased train lengths and frequencies, and personal hygiene guidelines. Please [Click Here](#) to view it.

Beginning June 13th, Muni increased service on the following routes:

- N Judah Bus (60-foot buses will be used to allow for better social distancing)
- 5 Fulton (full route restored)
- 7 Noriega Community Shuttle (servicing a portion of the 7 Noriega line between Ortega/48th and Funston/Irving, allows for connections to N Bus and 28 19th Avenue)
- 28 19th Avenue (route extended to California and 7th to provide connections to the 1 California and 38 Geary)
- 30 Stockton (full route restored)
- 38 Geary (modified outbound route ending at Geary and 32nd Avenue)
- 43 Masonic (modified route restored between Masonic/Geary and Munich/Geneva)

Weekday service frequencies also improved by 1-2 minutes on the following lines to allow for better physical distancing:

- L Bus
- T Bus
- 14R Mission Rapid

For paratransit users, SFMTA has announced the [Essential Trip Card](#) program to subsidize seniors and those with disabilities to make essential trips in taxis.

AC Transit:

Transbay service lines F, NL, O, and 800 will continue operation, with many local lines operating on a Sunday schedule. Weekday-only lines for both local and Transbay lines will not be operating.

[Fare payment](#) is **not** required until further notice and rear-door boarding has been implemented.

Caltrain:

As of June 15th, Caltrain is continuing reduced weekday schedules of 70 trains per day. Local weekday stops between San Jose and San Francisco will be made approximately every hour. [Click here](#) for the timetables.

Baby Bullet trains service continue to be suspended until further notice.

Golden Gate Transit:

Golden Gate Ferry is currently operating reduced weekday service. Weekend ferry service has been suspended. [Click Here](#) for ferry schedules.

Beginning [April 15](#), Golden Gate Transit and Ferry will be limiting passengers and require face masks on board their vehicles.

An increase in Golden Gate Bridge toll rates and Golden Gate Transit Bus/Ferry fares took effect July 1st. [Click Here](#) for more information about toll rate increases and [Here](#) for information about bus and ferry fare increases.

Additional Golden Gate Transit service changes will go into effect Sunday, July 12th. Please see the following for details or [Click Here](#) for more information:

- Service on routes **2, 8, 38A, 40X, 58, 72X, 74, 76, 92, and 101X** will be suspended
- Service on commute routes **4, 18, 24, 27, 38, 54, and 56X** will be reduced
- The number of **Route 72** trips will be increased to accommodate for changes to Routes 72X, 74, and 76
- Routes **30, 40, 70, and 101** will operate hourly with added half-hourly service during weekday peak trips on Routes 30, 40, and 70
- Suspension of service on routes **4C, 24C, 24X, 25, and 54C** will continue

As of April 26th, Samtrans implemented a modified schedule with service reductions on 31 routes. [Click Here](#) for route-by-route information.

Fare will not be required to ride Samtrans and rear-boarding has been implemented on buses. Riders and operators will be required to wear face coverings. Riders needing assistance will still be able to board through the front doors.

Please note Samtrans is operating on a non-school day schedule during the weekdays and will not serve stops labeled as “School Days Only”.

The following changes are in effect as of March 17:

- Reduced weekday service on the Alameda/Oakland and Vallejo routes
- No service on the Harbor Bay and South San Francisco ferry routes
- No weekend service or service to Pier 41 on any routes
