

## Essential Worker Ride Home

The San Francisco Department of the Environment is currently providing [essential workers](#) with subsidized taxi rides homes. The program covers the cost of rides home for essential workers commuting to and within San Francisco. This is a generous program that covers up to ten rides per month, per person, and up to \$70 a ride. **Uber and Lyft trips are not eligible for reimbursement.**

Participants must first [submit an application](#) to verify employment status, need, and use. Once approved, participants can take a **taxi** for eligible trips and request a reimbursement with a valid taxi receipt within 14 calendar days of the trip. Please see below for eligibility requirements:

To be eligible, you must:

- Commute to work via a sustainable mode of transportation, like public transit, walking, biking, or carpooling.
- Work for an essential business **in San Francisco** performing an [essential job function](#), as classified by the City and County of San Francisco.
- Certify that your employer does not already provide transportation benefits that include travel arrangements home from work.

For a trip to be eligible, it must:

- Originate at the participant's work location **in San Francisco** and end at their home, a transit stop that will take them home, or the location of their parked car
- Be taken between the hours of 9:00 pm and 8:30 am when transit options are limited or unavailable due to current service reductions or suspensions.
- Be made [via taxi](#). Meter fare, service fees, and toll fees **are eligible** for reimbursement. Tips and rides made using ridesharing companies, such as Uber and Lyft will not be reimbursed.
