



SFUSD REOPENS FALL 2021

SFUSD, partnering with UCSF, hosted a series of town halls to provide information and announced details on reopening district-wide full-time, 5 days a week. The first day of instruction for the fall semester begins August 16, 2021. Please note that although the [CDC](#) has announced that vaccinated teachers and students will not be required to wear face masks, SFUSD will continue to require that face masks be worn by both teachers and students.

SFUSD ANNOUNCEMENTS

- The school setting will look like it did in December 2019 **but with face masks**. Social distancing will not be required.
- ExCEL After School Programs, Early Education Out of School Time Programs, and community organizations and private groups before and after school programs will resume.
- Coordinated care teams (nurses, counselors, social workers) will be present at schools to support children and families.

HEALTH AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

School staff and students must:

- Self-screen for COVID-19 **before** going to school daily.
- Stay home when sick.
- Wear face masks at all times before getting on the school bus or entering school, except when eating or drinking. Students with documented medical reasons are exempt.
- Wash or sanitize hands frequently.

GOALS FOR SFUSD

- Have all students and teachers vaccinated before the fall reopening. Phillip and Sala Burton High School will have a vaccination site open every Wednesday and Thursday from 3:30PM – 7:30PM until July 15th to support this endeavor. No appointments are required.
- Move adequate amounts of furniture back into classrooms.
- Perform repairs or installations to ensure each classroom or multi-person office has at least one of the following: open windows, portable air cleaner, mechanical ventilation.
