Beginning in January 2022, some Montgomery and Powell Station escalators will be closed for approximately 6 months in order to construct canopies at stations. [Bay Area Toll Bridge Fare Increase](#)

Effective January 1st, 2022

The Bay Area Toll Authority (BATA) reminds drivers that tolls in the region's seven state-owned toll bridges will go up by \$1 (from \$6 to \$7) on January 1st, 2022. Peak-period toll discounts for motorcycles, carpools and qualifying clean-air vehicles crossing state-owned toll bridges on weekdays from 5AM to 10AM and from 3PM to 7PM will increase by 50 cents from \$3 to \$3.50.

The seven state-owned bridges are San Francisco-Oakland Bay, Antioch, Benicia-Martinez, Carquinez, Dumbarton, Richmond-San Rafael and San Mateo-Hayward. The rise in price will not affect the Golden Gate Bridge, which is run by the Golden Gate Bridge Highway and Transportation District.
