

# COVID-19 Essential Resources

## SUMMARY

The rise of the [COVID-19's Omicron variant](#) is fostering changing conditions in vaccinations and booster shots. Local, state, and federal restrictions are also constantly shifting. [TMA SF Connects](#) has created a factsheet on the latest updates. We are covering COVID-19 information, vaccinations and booster shots, and restrictions.

## HIGHLIGHTS

### COVID-19 Vaccination and Booster Shot Information

**Anyone over the age of 5** is now eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine. SF Gov has a [list](#) of vaccine sites.

**Anyone over the age of 12** who has been fully vaccinated with Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson and Johnson vaccines are eligible for a [booster shot](#). SFist has created a [map](#) of sites for booster shots.

### COVID-19 Restrictions and Mask Requirements

The TSA is [extending face mask requirements](#) on all transportation networks including local public transportation (BART, Muni, etc.) through March 18, 2022.

California is [extending its indoor mask mandate](#) until February 15, 2022.

SFUSD remains open for in-person learning and is welcoming students back for school in the [new year, following](#) San Francisco Department of Public Health's newest [guidance](#) measures.

The San Francisco Department of Public Health has also [announced](#) that beginning January 15, "mega-events" will only allow 500 attendees indoors and 5,000 attendees outdoors. KRON4 has an [article](#) on additional safety and vaccination requirements for these events, including proof of a booster shot.

### COVID-19 Major Developments

Beginning January 15, the Biden-Harris Administration is [requiring private health coverage to reimburse](#) Americans for up to eight at-home COVID-19 tests a month. The Administration is also [increasing COVID-19 testing](#) in schools to keep students safe and schools open, providing 10 million tests to schools per month.
